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The Hintemeyer Catholic Leadership Scholarship

“Pursue Goodness”

Program Purpose: “Charity towards all” defines the spirit of Hintemeyer scholars. The program forms young Catholics to be men and women of integrity, charity, and prayer, and empowers them to be Christlike leaders at Belmont Abbey College and for the rest of their lives.

Student Experience: Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament; Lectio Divina; Monthly Dinner and Formation Nights; Leadership opportunities with Campus Ministry and Charlotte Diocese.

Scholarship Details: \$6,500 annually. Must have a 3.2 GPA

The Saint Thomas More Civic Integrity Scholarship

“Pursue Truth”

Program Purpose: Saint Thomas More exemplified the Renaissance tradition of bringing classical learning to bear on political life. In keeping with More’s example, our program seeks young men and women who are looking for a “Renaissance” education and believe in the importance of civic engagement.

Student Experience: Enjoy a rich Spring Seminar Course and visiting speakers developed for morally serious and civically-minded students who are interested in engaging with the vital moral, ethical and political affairs of the time with courage and wisdom. Apply Seminar principles to a Debate, Mock Court, Model UN, or Internship Experience.

Scholarship Details: \$5,500 annually. Must have a 3.3 GPA

The Oetgen Performing Arts Scholarship

“Pursue Beauty”

Program Purpose: Fr. John Oetgen was a monk who served as president of Belmont Abbey College from 1960-1964 and had a strong passion for the performing arts. The Oetgen program is a four-year educational and social experience designed to encourage and strengthen students who have an interest in theatre or dance, either as a performer or technician.

Student Experience: Minor in Theatre or Dance and receive technical training applied to choice of Major. Serve in various ways in the four plays and four showcase events.

Scholarship Details: \$5,500 annually. Must have a 2.75 GPA

Prospective Events: Students 13 years of age or older may get a taste for the program at the Triple Threat Workshop in June.

Enrollment

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Articulation Agreement

- Belmont Abbey will accept up to 60 college credits from The Angelicum Academy (TAA) students
 - Up to 48 credits (6 credits for each TAA course) will be accepted from The Angelicum Academy Great Books Program
 - Up to 12 credits (3 credits for each TAA course) will be accepted from the Theology Online program
- These credits will cover the Belmont Abbey Core Curriculum, but depending on the students selected major, they may be required to “retake” a major specific intro level course
 - A Belmont Abbey Bachelor’s degree requires 120 credits, so students can transfer up to **half the degree requirements**
 - Student must have a grade of C or higher for course credit to be transferred

Admissions Process

- Submit your application at bac.edu/apply or through the Common App
- Send transcripts to admissions@bac.edu
- We are test score optional for admissions and scholarships
- Merit scholarship awards will be sent in the student's acceptance letter
- Apply for desired Premier Scholarship(s)

Prior to enrolling in classes with Belmont Abbey students will need to send a final official transcript to the Registrar's Office to confirm credits.
