^ This sample college plan is designed for students to earn their AA degree (60 college credits) over four years completing their AA degree at the end of their High School Senior year. It is also possible for students to complete the AA program in 3 years. Students would do so through one or more of several options including: (1) taking more than one of the Great Books courses in the same Fall/Spring semesters; (2) taking one of the of the four Great Books courses asynchronously in the summer; and (3) taking more than one UST course per semester. Note Bene: The total cost of the AA if done in 3 years remains the same. The AA track tuition is a fixed total, divided by four years. If a student completes it in three years, the final year tuition will be higher based on the total number of credits earned. Please call with any questions. This plan assumes students take 1 UST course per semester as outlined above. Students may opt to take more than one UST course per semester but are limited to 5 total UST courses. Theology Online courses must be completed at Angelicum. Angelicum requires 3 years of High School Math and Science and 4 years of Religion for its Diploma. Some UST courses may count for dual high school and college credit.

\* The Theology Online courses are included in tuition for the AA Degree with UST. Only 45 Great Books or Theology Online courses count towards the AA; the rest of the credits could go towards a BA. If the Theology Online courses are not taken, two additional high school religion courses would be required to fulfill Angelicum's high school diploma requirements.

\*\* This draft college plan assures all 5 UST courses required for the AA are completed by the Senior year. The UST classes listed for any UST semester are suggestions only. Students may take 5 of the many courses available in the order they prefer and according to what is offered by UST in a particular semester. As with any college program, all students/parents must carefully manage their course schedule based on the UST academic offerings in any given semester. Each individual student plan should be reviewed at the beginning and end of each semester for any required adjustments.
